Yeshiva University Beren Campus *Student Council* Application **Elections 2019-2020**

The **Election Information Session** will be on Wednesday March 27th, 2019 at 7 p.m. in Koch Auditorium.

Please **submit your signatures** by 12:00 p.m. on Monday, April 8th to Zehavya Stadlan of the Office of Student Life on the 5th floor of 215 Lexington Avenue.

Campaigning will begin on Thursday, April 11 until Wednesday, May 1th.

The **Candidate Presentation Night** will be on Tuesday, April 30th at 7 p.m. in Yagoda Commons.

Elections will be held on Thursday, May 2nd.



To Be Eligible:

- 1) One must be in good academic standing and not on probation.
- 2) To run for executive board, one must have record of service or leadership (including but not limited to: club head, class board member, RA or captain of an athletic team). Fulfillment of this requirement is at the discretion of the canvassing committee. Presidents must have a record of leadership in the school.
- 3) For class board, one must be academically in that class (ex. Senior Class President must be an academic Senior).
- 4) One must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher to run for executive or class board.
- 5) No student may run for any position if she will be graduating before May of the year in which she will serve her term.
- 6) One must be a full time student on campus the semesters of and preceding the term she will serve.
- 7) One must live in University Housing if elected, or you may appeal to the canvassing committee.
- 8) The executive board and class presidents may not chair any other clubs, committees, or organizations, though they may be members. They also may not serve as an RA or Editor in Chief of any publication.
- 9) If an elected officer becomes a member of another class whilst serving her term, she shall complete her elected term, unless the previous class opposes.
- 10) Student Council Presidents must be incoming seniors.

Executive Board Positions:

- 1) Candidates for presidents must each obtain 200 signatures.
- 2) Candidates for any other position on an executive board must each obtain 150 signatures.
- 3) All signatures MUST be from current SCW/SSSB students.

Class Board Positions:

- 1) Candidates for presidents must each obtain 75 signatures.
- 2) Candidates for any other position on a class board must obtain 50 signatures.
 - a. Candidates for sophomore class board must obtain 20 signatures.
- 3) All signatures MUST be from respective class members.

Campaigning Rules:

- 1) Candidates eligible for applied position will receive confirmation and approval of application by 5:00pm on Wednesday, April 10th.



- 2) Campaigning begins on Thursday, April 11th – NO EARLIER.
- 3) If you are running for executive board, your campaign expenses may not exceed \$75. This is in addition to cost of printing through school accounts.
- 4) If you are running for class board, your campaign expenses may not exceed \$50. This is in addition to cost of printing through school accounts.
- 5) NO MONEY SPENT ON CAMPAIGNING IS REIMBURSABLE.
- 6) One may not give any items away to students. This does not include stickers.
- 7) No sign may exceed 8 1/2 x 11 inches.
- 8) Flyers may NOT be hung in the elevators of any building. If using tape for flyers, [painter's](#) (blue) tape MUST be used.
- 9) There will be a “Candidate Presentation Night” held the evening of Tuesday, April 30th. Candidates for ANY position must attend. Details of forum will be emailed directly to you.
- 10) Flyers MUST be taken down no later than 5:00PM EST Wednesday, May 1st.
- 11) Write-in candidates are permitted to run for any position. In order to qualify, a write-in must obtain 50 votes for executive board and 25 votes for class board. Following the election, any write-in candidates whom are elected must meet with the Canvassing Committee and the Office of Student Life. Campaigning rules 2-10 apply to write-in candidates as well.

*If any candidate fails to adhere to these rules, she is subject to be disqualified from the 2019 Elections under the discretion of the Canvassing Committee.

Write-In Process:

- 1) Any student that wants to run as a Write-in needs to make sure that they are eligible for the position.
- 2) Write-in candidates are permitted to run for any position. In order to qualify, a write-in must obtain 50 votes for executive board and 25 votes for class board. Following the election, any write-in candidates whom are elected must meet with the Canvassing Committee and the Office of Student Life. Campaigning rules 2-10 apply to write-in candidates as well.

*If any candidate fails to adhere to these rules, she is subject to be disqualified from the 2019 Elections under the discretion of the Canvassing Committee.
